

Sport

Students can participate in a wide range of interschool sports, including basketball, netball, tennis, volleyball, football, soccer, cricket and baseball.

Compulsory School Uniform

All students wear the Seaton High School uniform, which builds a positive school image, and contributes to student safety by helping staff to ensure that only Seaton students are on the school grounds.

Fees

Seaton's fees are currently \$550 for year 8 students. This includes a diary, ID and library card, printing and Internet use.

Seaton Supporting Achievement

All Year 8 and 9 students give formal Presentations of their achievement to panels of parents, teachers and community representatives.

The ASPIRE and Middle School Leadership Programs provide leadership opportunities for current and future leaders.

The Senior and Middle School Councils also provide leadership opportunities and represent students' views in school decision-making processes.

Regular homework is set in all classes.

Details are entered into the diary each day. The Homework Centres and Maths Homework Centre are open on several afternoons.

Three Student Counsellors provide personal counselling and career guidance.

Extra learning support is provided through the **Student Learning Program**, on an individual basis or through extra support in classrooms.

Music students can receive individual tuition.

Convenient Public Transport to Seaton

Buses from West Lakes Mall, the Port and LeFevre Peninsula, and also from Grange Road, stop directly outside the school on Frederick Road. Other buses pass along Tapleys Hill Road. The train station is 10 minutes walk from the school.

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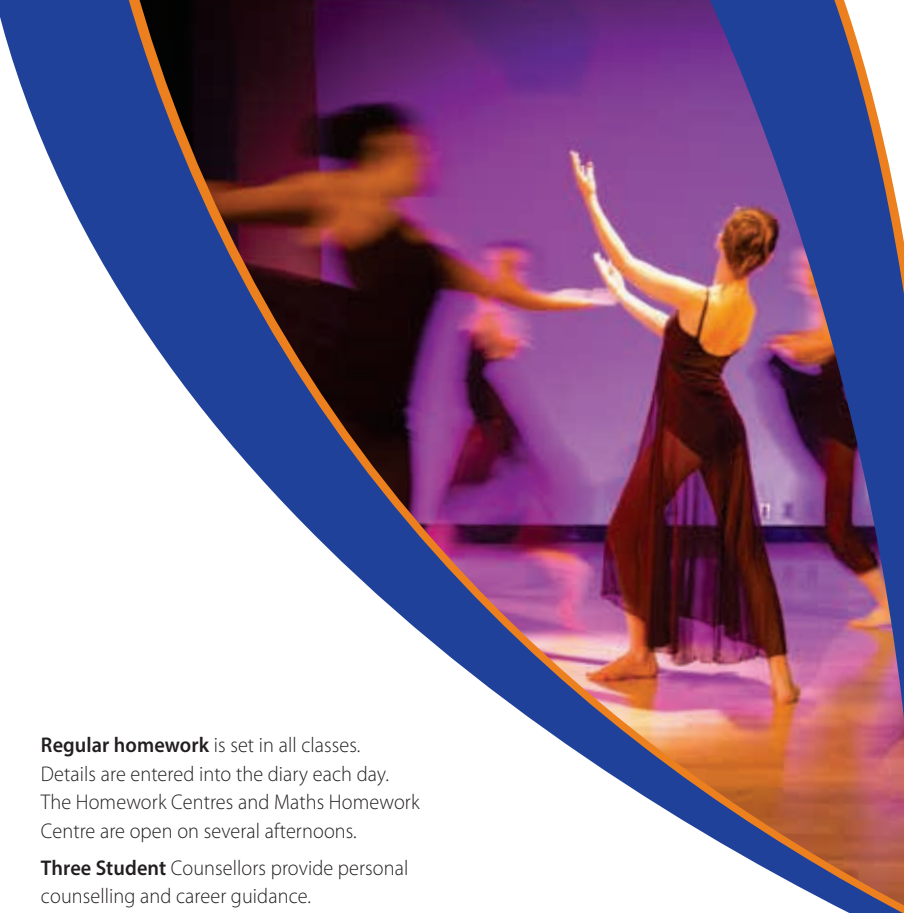

Our current total of 860 students provides a good balance between the personal approach of a smaller school, and the broad range of subjects and facilities of a larger school. Seaton ensures that we know each individual well, and that no student is anonymous. Speedy and appropriate support and supervision can then be provided.

Seaton's Culture of Achievement

- Seaton has high expectations that all students can and will achieve academic success through active, interesting, intellectually challenging learning. Students' achievements are publicly recognised.
- Seaton educates the whole person to develop a set of positive values and skills that we call our Graduate Qualities: teamwork, responsibility, persistence, self-organisation and self-confidence. These qualities underpin students' academic and social success.
- Seaton has clear procedures which are consistently applied. Misbehaviour or harassment is not tolerated and is met with strong consequences. No student is allowed to interfere with the rights, safety or learning of others.
- Seaton's strong organisation enables the school to focus energy on the big positive issues of student learning and wellbeing.

Results: Literacy and Numeracy

Seaton students consistently achieve well above the state average in the national Year 9 Literacy and Numeracy tests.

Year 12 Results

Seaton students consistently achieve excellent results, high SACE completion rates (over 95% in recent years) and high preference offers to University and TAFE. In recent years students have been offered positions in courses including: Medicine, Law, Engineering, Science, Speech Pathology, Graphics and Design, Arts, Nutrition and Dietetics, Psychology, Occupational Therapy and Economics.

Nearly all Seaton students go on to worthwhile pathways in tertiary study, traineeships and apprenticeships, or employment.

Seaton's Directions

Seaton has a clear direction and priorities for the coming years.

Seaton's Middle School

Year 8 and 9 students study most of their subjects in stable home classes. The number of teachers for each class is kept to a minimum, so that teachers know their students well, and can provide prompt support and tight supervision to meet students' individual needs.

All Year 8 students currently study a broad course of

- English, Japanese, and History
- Geography
- Maths and Science
- Health and Physical Activity, choosing Physical Education, Dance or Baseball
- Technology (e.g. woodwork, metalwork, electronics)
- Food and Nutrition
- The Arts: Visual Art or Performing Arts

English as an Additional Language or Dialect and other special assistance are provided as needed.

All year 8 and 9 students are taught Literacy, Higher Order Thinking and Computer Skills as part of their regular courses.

Seaton's Senior School

This sound preparation in the Middle School equips students to make informed subject and career choices, and to graduate successfully into a wide range of pathways to tertiary study and employment.

Year 11 and 12 Courses offered in 2017

Vocational Education

Seaton's Trade Training Centre offers school and trade courses in Electrotechnology and Plumbing. Students can also access many other courses in TAFE, and school-based apprenticeships and traineeships.

Technology

Seaton has a sophisticated computer network, linking all classrooms to the Internet via wireless and fibre-optic technology. Specialist computer labs are equipped with modern computers; banks of notebook computers are also available. All Year 10, 11 & 12 students can access a device for their personal use as part of the Senior School Laptop Program.
